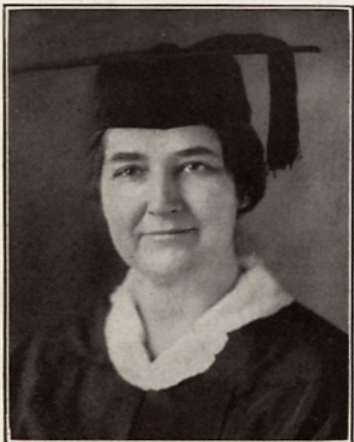

# Farewell

It is always difficult to bid farewell to a friend, and never was the sorrow more evident than when the time came for the faculty, administration, and students of the School of Pharmacy to say goodbye to their most loyal and faithful friend, Miss B. Olive Cole.

To relate the career of our Miss Cole is almost to outline the history of our school itself. From 1913 to 1953—for forty years—these two grew up together, each aiding and depending upon the other. In 1920, after several years in a retail drugstore, Miss Cole returned, by request, to her Alma Mater to become Assistant Professor of Botany and Materia Medica. Even though she became a member of the Maryland Bar in 1923, Miss Cole, fortunately for us, continued to cast her lot with pharmacy. From that time until November 1953, she served the School of Pharmacy well in a multiplicity of positions, as Acting Dean after the death of Dr. DuMez in 1948, as Professor of Pharmacy Administration, as Secretary of the Faculty, and as teacher of a variety of subjects, including pharmacy law, management, accounting, and botany.

We students, past as well as present, recognize and honor her record as a teacher; but most of all, we shall miss her valuable guidance and counsel, given so freely with so much friendliness and sincerity. Long will it be before we become accustomed to her absence from her familiar desk in the office, no more to be greeted by her warm smile and helping hand.

And so, in tribute to her long and truly devoted service to the School of Pharmacy, the TERRA MARIAE 1954, with sincere and grateful appreciation, tenders this Farewell with the hope that she may have a lengthy and rewarding retirement.

## DR. B. OLIVE COLE

The B. Olive Cole Pharmacy Museum was established by the Maryland Pharmaceutical Association in honor of Dr. B. Olive Cole, Professor Emerita of Pharmacy Administration, University of Maryland, School of Pharmacy. The museum is located in the Kelly Memorial Building, headquarters of the MPA at 650 West Lombard Street, on the Baltimore campus of the University of Maryland, adjoining Dunning Hall of the School of Pharmacy.

Dr. Cole was a member of the faculty from 1920 until her retirement in 1953. From 1948 to 1949 she served as Acting Dean.

Dr. B. Olive Cole, known as "First Lady of Pharmacy in Maryland" has blazed a trail of outstanding services and "firsts for women" that few women can match. Among her many unique "firsts for women" are: First woman to receive a law degree from University of Maryland; first acting Dean of U. of M. School of Pharmacy; first to hold a full professorship at the University's School of Pharmacy, honorary president of Maryland Pharmaceutical Association; honorary president of Alumni Association of the School of Pharmacy, a recipient of the Honored Alumnus award, and only woman member of Baltimore Veteran Druggists Association.

Born in Mt. Carmel, Baltimore County, she graduated from Franklin High School in 1902.

Dr. Cole began her career as a stenographer with the firm of Sharp & Dohme, drug manufacturers, now Merck Sharp & Dohme, when its headquarters were in Baltimore. As a result, she entered the University of Maryland, receiving the degree of Doctor of Pharmacy in 1913.

From 1916 to 1920 she was employed as a pharmacist in Washington. In 1920 she joined the staff of the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy, serving as secretary of the faculty for over quarter of a century. In addition, she taught botany, materia medica, economics and pharmaceutical law.

Dr. Cole is a life member of both the Maryland Pharmaceutical Association and the American Pharmaceutical Association and a charter member of Epsilon Chapter of Lambda Kappa Sigma Sorority. She served as president of the Baltimore Branch of the American Pharmaceutical Association in 1934 and secretary of the Alumni Association of the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy. She was a charter member and past president of the Quota Club International.

Dr. Cole also attended Baltimore Business College and Johns Hopkins University where she pursued studies in English, history and economics.

The Cole Museum will encompass exhibition cases in the foyer of the Kelly Memorial Building, the main meeting hall on the lower level and the adjoining room, which is planned as the L. Manuel Hendler Apothecary Shop as a restoration of an old-time pharmacy.
